

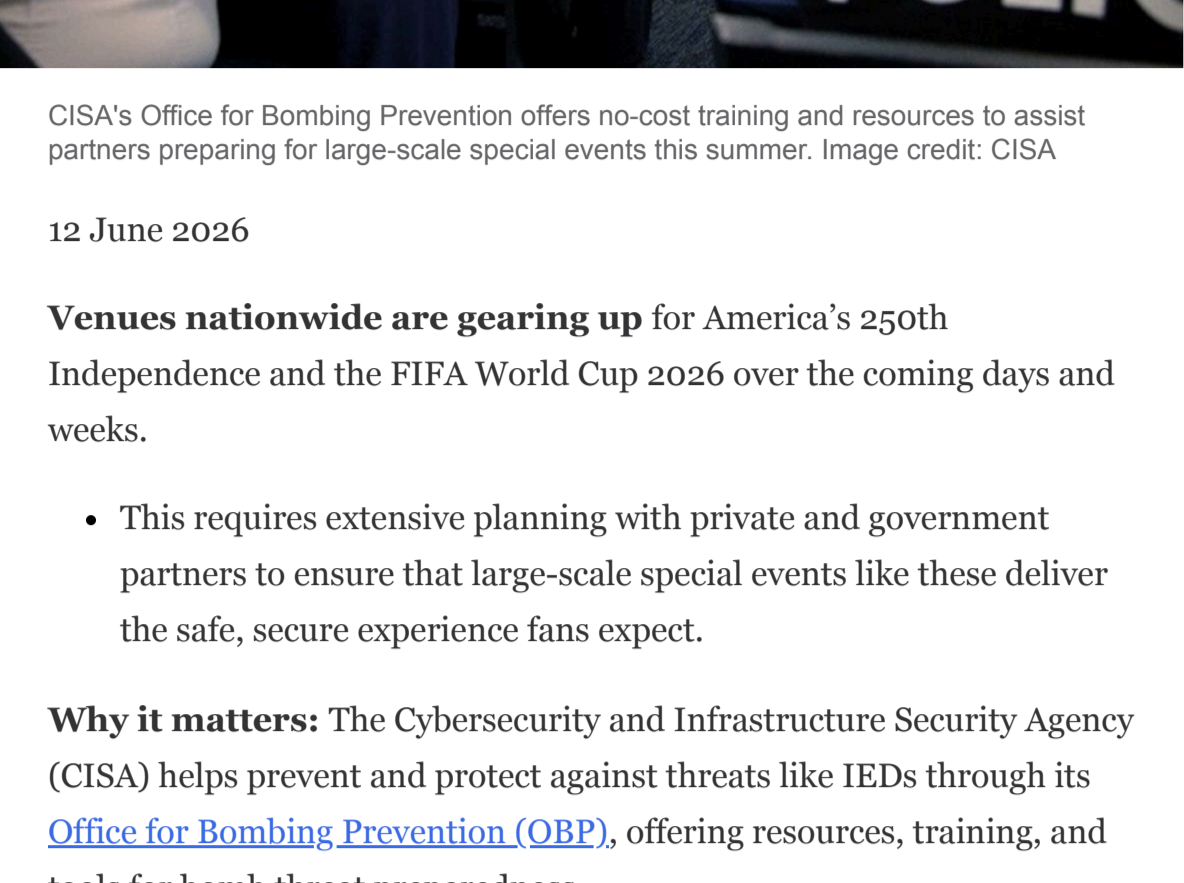

CISA offers vital resources as venues prepare for key 2026 events

Venues nationwide are gearing up for America's 250th Independence and the FIFA World Cup 2026 over the coming days and weeks.

- This requires extensive planning with private and government partners to ensure that large-scale special events like these deliver the safe, secure experience fans expect.

Why it matters: The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) helps prevent and protect against threats like IEDs through its [Office for Bombing Prevention \(OBP\)](#), offering resources, training, and tools for bomb threat preparedness.

Training for bombing prevention and preparedness: OBP provides no-cost training to identify, assess, and respond to bombing threats for law enforcement, first responders, security professionals, and more. Courses include:

- [Bomb Threat Management Workshop](#): Offers guidance on effective bomb threat management plans.
 - [Suspicious Behaviors and Items](#): Teaches recognition and response to suspicious behaviors.
 - [IED Awareness and Safety Procedures](#): Provides knowledge on identifying IEDs and safe response.
 - [Homemade Explosives Awareness](#): Helps recognize materials indicating homemade explosives.
 - [VBIED Detection Workshop](#): Focuses on identifying vehicle-borne threats.
- Training is available in-person, virtually, and online.

Tools and resources for preparedness: CISA guides event planners in developing security measures with tools like the [Bomb Threat Guidance](#), [VBIED Identification](#) card to help recognize suspicious indicators, [Suspicious UAS Identification](#), and the [Mass Gathering Security Planning Tool](#).

Collaborative preparedness: CISA works with local and international partners to enhance preparedness and response to bomb threats.

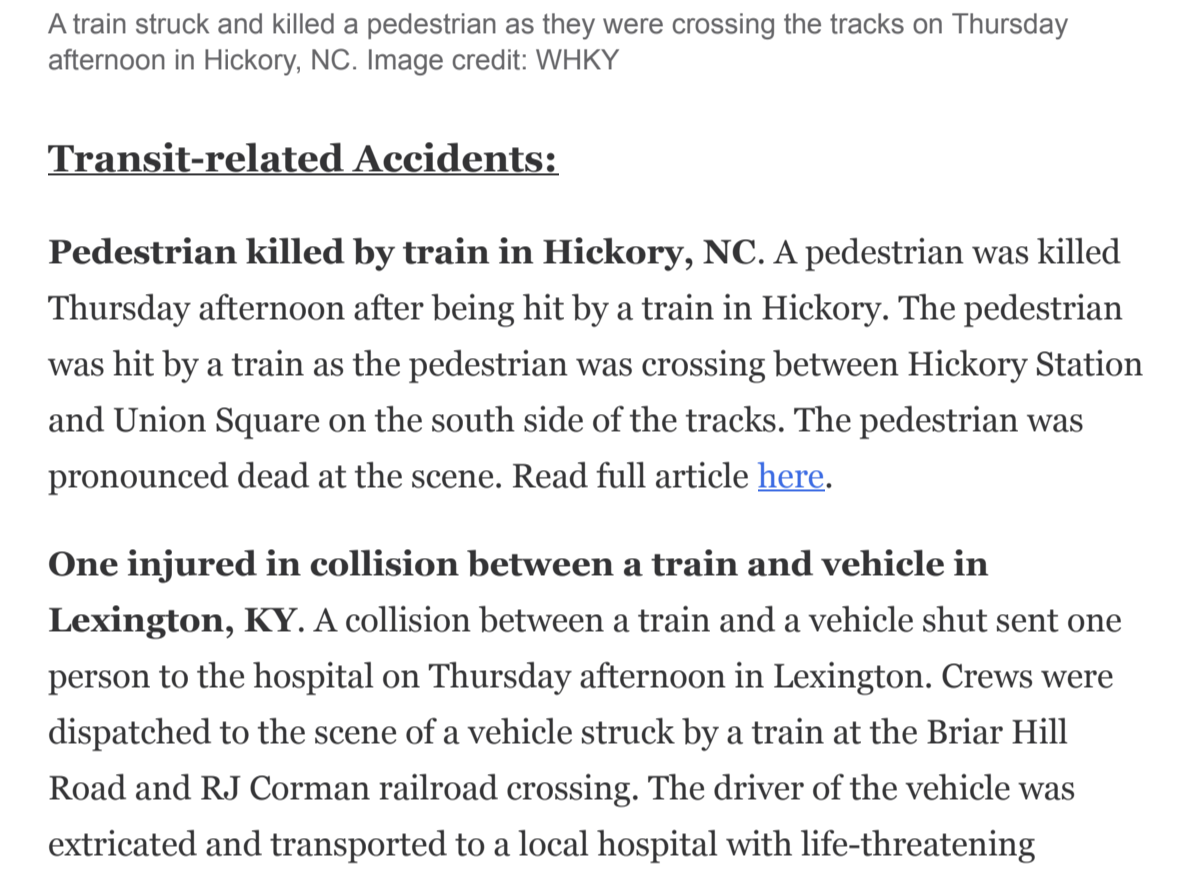
- Collaboration strengthens national resilience.

Transit-related Accidents:

Pedestrian killed by train in Hickory, NC. A pedestrian was killed Thursday afternoon after being hit by a train in Hickory. The pedestrian was hit by a train as the pedestrian was crossing between Hickory Station and Union Square on the south side of the tracks. The pedestrian was pronounced dead at the scene. One injured in collision between a train and vehicle in Lexington, KY. A collision between a train and a vehicle shut sent one person to the hospital on Thursday afternoon in Lexington. Crews were dispatched to the scene of a vehicle struck by a train at the Briar Hill Road and RJ Corman railroad crossing. Evacuation order lifted following train derailment in Lancing, TN. Residents can return to their homes after officials lifted an evacuation order following a train derailment in Lancing. Officials confirmed 15 to 20 cars derailed and four or five of them contained ethanol. The derailment happened in a remote area with no road access, making it challenging for emergency personnel to get to the scene. Driver killed after crashing into OmniTrans bus in Colton, CA. A driver was killed after crashing into an OmniTrans bus in Colton on Wednesday evening. Police were called to a collision near South Mt Vernon Avenue and Centerpoint Drive. The driver had crashed into the rear of an OmniTrans bus that was stopped at a red light. The driver was pronounced dead at the scene. Several passengers in the bus reported minor injuries but declined transportation to the hospital. The bus driver was uninjured. Transit Crime:

Woman shot after meeting up for fistfight at downtown MetroLink station in St. Louis, MO. A woman was shot Thursday night at a downtown St. Louis MetroLink station. Officers responded to a shooting call at the 8th and Pine MetroLink station. Two women met up to engage in a fistfight. During the incident, one woman was shot. The shooting injuries were not life-threatening. No arrests had been made. MetroLink trains were briefly stopped following the incident before resuming normal operations. Gunfire strikes NJ Transit bus, injures passenger in Elizabeth, NJ. A passenger aboard an NJ Transit bus was injured when gunfire struck the vehicle in Elizabeth on Wednesday night. The bus was in service when it was struck by gunfire near Third Street and Magnolia Drive. The shots also damaged two unoccupied cars parked in the area. Investigators said two gunmen fired multiple shots in the area and fled the scene on foot. The injured female passenger suffered minor injuries and declined medical care. Police believe the bus was the shooters' intended target. The suspects are still at large as the investigation continues. Read full article [here](#).

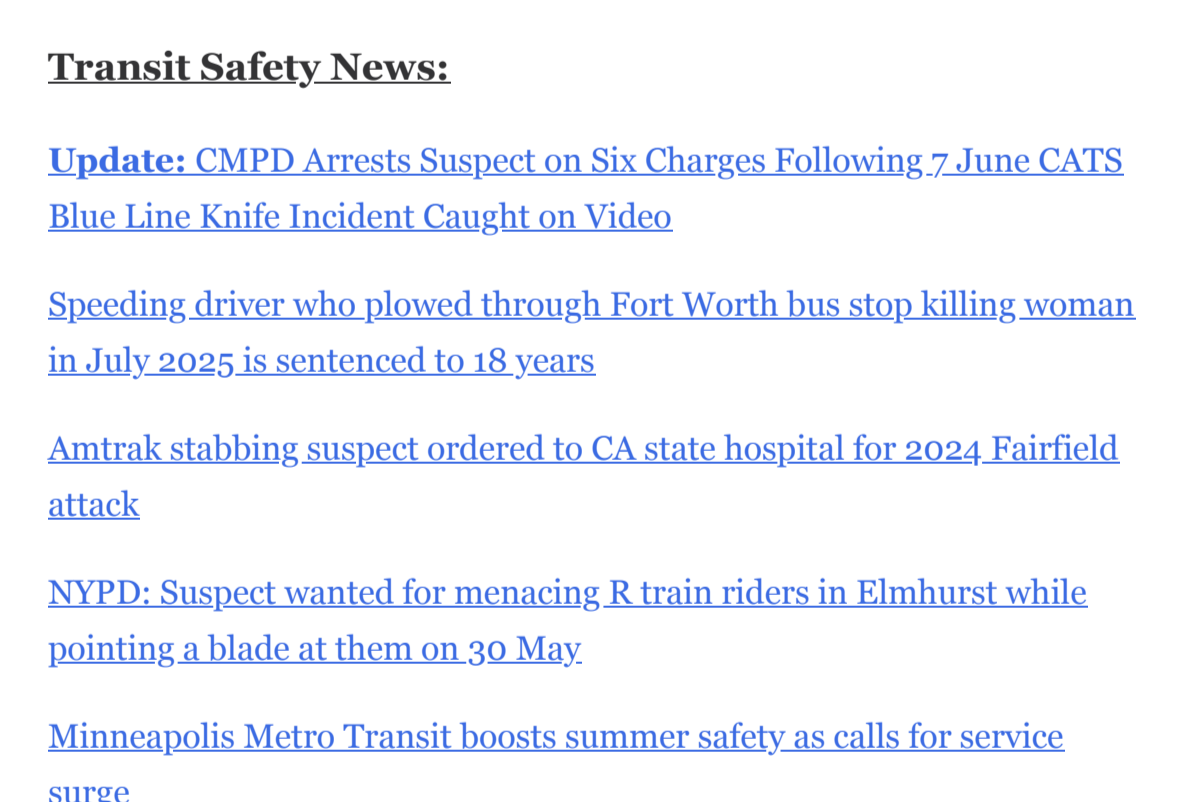
